Vietnam Education Foundation
Location: Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam

The Vietnam Education Foundation (VEF) is seeking eight (6) well-qualified Vietnamese to act as volunteers in July and August 2014 during the second phase of the VEF Fellowship selection process for Cohort 2015, namely, the Oral Exam/Interview, which is also referred to as the VEF Mission. Three (3) volunteers will work in Hanoi and three (3) will work in Ho Chi Minh City. The volunteers will assist VEF staff with all logistics arrangements for the Mission. Details are described as follows.

Position Descriptions: The volunteers assist VEF with the following tasks:

- Managing the reception table during the interview days.
- Escorting and guiding the U.S scientists/their companions/and the VEF U.S. staff to lectures, meetings, historical sites, cultural events, or other sites requested by guests.
- Assisting VEF staff with logistics-related tasks as requested.

The volunteers in Hanoi will report to the Senior Manager of Finance and Administration and in Ho Chi Minh City to the VEF Program Manager.

Working Time/Dates: The volunteers are expected to work for five (5) days in Hanoi (July 28 through August 1) and five (5) days in Ho Chi Minh City (August 3 through 7) on a full-time basis, which may include long hours from early morning through late evening, as needed, to accomplish the work. Volunteers are expected to wear business casual attire (no jeans, shorts or tennis shoes). The volunteers are requested to attend a one-hour Orientation Meeting for VEF volunteers on July 28 at VEF Hanoi Office in Hanoi or on August 3 at New World Saigon Hotel in Ho Chi Minh City. Exact time and venues will be informed to the volunteers later.

Benefits: This voluntary job provides the following opportunities for the volunteers: (1) to learn more about VEF, which is a U.S. Federal Government agency with a mission to strengthen the U.S.-Vietnam bilateral relationship through educational exchanges in science and technology; (2) to practice English with native English speakers while improving communication skills, learning about American culture and sharing the Vietnamese culture with U.S. guests; (3) to work closely with the VEF teams from both Washington, D.C., and Hanoi, as well as with the profound U.S. professors; (4) to meet outstanding young Vietnamese, who are candidates for the VEF Fellowships; and (5) to receive a VEF Certificate recognizing the volunteer's contribution to the VEF Mission.

Financial Benefit:

- This voluntary job is a non-paid position. However, all volunteers are invited to join the following activities hosted by VEF either in Hanoi or Ho Chi Minh City. Specific times are as follows:

- + In Hanoi: Three (3) lunches at Sofitel Plaza Hanoi Hotel on July 30, 31 and August 1;
- + In Ho Chi Minh City: Three (3) lunches at New World Saigon Hotel on August 4, 5, and 6.

Note: The volunteers do not have to pay taxi bills/fares when they escort the U.S scientists and/or their dependents. These expenditures will be covered by the scientists and/or their dependents themselves.

Required Qualifications:

1. Vietnamese national.
2. High level of English proficiency.
3. Graduate or university student, with a specialization in English, international affairs, or a related field.
4. Available on July 28 through August 1 (in Hanoi) or August 3 through 7 (in Ho Chi Minh City) for the Mission.
5. High level of flexibility regarding hours and days of work as well as job duties.
6. Ability to travel by car within Hanoi (for volunteers in Hanoi) and ability to travel by car within Ho Chi Minh City (for volunteers in Ho Chi Minh City).
7. Positive attitude, enthusiasm, and interest in supportive teamwork.
